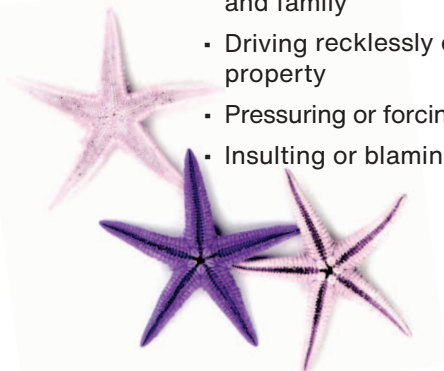




Is someone hurting you? You are not alone.
